Sokol Spirit's 1st Friday (of the Month) Films 2016-17 Season Czech Film Series (English subtitles)

October 7: Czech Dream/Český sen; 2004, 88 minutes PG-Comedy Documents the largest consumer hoax and its social aspects It recorded a large-scale hoax perpetrated by Klusák and Remunda on the Czech public, culminating in the opening event of a fake hypermarket in the Letňany neighborhood of Prague. The film was their graduation project for film school.

November 4: The Country Teacher/VENKOVSKÝ UCITEL; 2009, 100 minutes, R-Drama Life Lessons Learned in Bucolic Classrooms. A new teacher is a pensive, bespectacled Czech in his 30 's who impulsively leaves Prague to take a job teaching natural science in a rural village. Both his subject and the rustic environment play into the movie's contemplation of biological diversity as it applies to human behavior, especially sexuality.

December 2: Men in Rut/Muzi v Riji 2009, 120 minutes, GP13-Political Satire...Humor from clash of small and big worlds as politicians in a remote burg - so remote, in fact, that the road ends there! The mayor of a tiny Czech village hatches a plan to quite literally put his town on the map.

September 20 Story of Hussities (*Husitska*) and their Inspiration for Antonin Dvorak At a time when Dvorák was being tempted to write opera in German for Vienna and Dresden came one of his most nationalistic works, the Hussite Overture. The overture was composed at the request of the Prague National Theatre, to accompany a projected trilogy on the subject of the Hussite period. While the drama never saw completion, the Overture was premiered on November 18, 1883, in celebration of the opening of the newly-built National Theatre, two years after a disastrous fire had destroyed the original. The overture is clearly modeled on the sketches for the trilogy, expressing the "origin of the Hussite movement" in the introduction, "the Hussite wars" in the exposition and development, and the "restoration of peace after the wars" in the recapitulation and coda. NOTE: Chicago Symphony Orchestra-on October 14 & 18, 2016 the *Husitska* Overture will be the first number in the program.

October 18 The folk music of the Czech Republic and its inspiration for Smetana's Work: <u>Slovanske Tance</u> There were three big Czech composers, who were carried away and inspired by the Czech and Moravian folklore-Dvorak, Janacek and Smetana. It might not be the coincidence that all three are world famous musicians, whose beautiful melodies transpire and reflect beautiful folklore and traditions. Antonin Dvorak included the Slavonic dances into his Eight Symphony. The 8th Symphony was written during the summer and early autumn of 1889, mainly at his summer residence in <u>Vysoka</u>. This environment, in which Dvorak was most at ease, seemed to be reflected in the overall atmosphere of his new symphony. NOTE: Chicago Symphony Orchestra-on November 17 & 18, 2016 Symphony No. 8 will be the last number in the program.

November 15 Story of Czech Christmas Carols-Koledy and Ginger Cookies Traditional Czech Christmas would not be the same without various types of Christmas cookies which are hand made by most of the Czech families. But as important are the Christmas national carols which bring us with the familiar melodies to the Christmas cheer and mood. Which carols were taken and translated from other countries and what were the inspirations to our most traditional Czech carols such as Narodil se Kristus Pan. Most carols were based on Christian context, but there were carols which carried underlying Communist agenda. Listen to Christmas Melodies and decorate Czech ginger cookies. Materials may be extra for cookies.
