News from the Education Director, Sis. Vera Wilt

Perhaps you are thinking of going to the World Slet in Prague in July 2018. More info in future newsletters.

Czech Language classes have started for the Fall. This year are offering **3 options: Monday Daytime Basic, Wednesday Daytime Intermediate, or Wednesday Evening Intermediate** classes. **All classes** are held in the upstairs classroom, and they use the following materials: Textbook *Basic Czech I* - by Ana Adamovicova and Darina Ivanovova (on Amazon \$18) + handouts. All sessions require a minimum enrollment of 3 full-time or 6 part-time students.

BASIC CZECH CONVERSATION & GRAMMAR: Session 2 is \$190 and runs in a 12-week segment, Session 3 will be 10 weeks (reduced price of \$160). If you know you cannot commit to the full 12 weeks, there is a part-time option of \$95 for 6 classes - must identify your weeks of attendance at registration. (Session 3 part-time is 5 weeks for \$80) **Basic Classes run from 10 AM to 11:30 AM on MONDAYS.**

Session II – January 8, 2018 – March 26 INTERMEDIATE CZECH CONVERSATION & GRAMMAR: All 3 Sessions are 12 weeks, at \$190 per session or part-time \$95 for 6 classes - must identify dates of attendance at registration. Intermediate Classes run either: WEDNESDAYS 9 AM – 10:30 AM OR 7 PM – 8:30 PM Session II – January 10, 2018 – March 28 Session III – April 11, 2018 – June 27 Register at the first class. Questions?
