I know my daughter was extremely fond of her and listened to anything she had to say. She could encourage them like none other. In Memoriam Sis. EllenJeanne Schnabl July 15, 1930-December 14, 2022

Sis. EllenJeanne Schnabl spent countless hours doing what she loved at Sokol Berwyn. In the early 1950s, she was a member of the American Sokol gymnastics team, traveling and competing around the country. She maintained a scrapbook that documents success in the championship division and includes both gymnastics and volleyball accolades.

Upon entering the women's class, she began her long tenure teaching nearly every age group. The Tots program did not exist in the Sokol system until EllenJeanne began it in the early 1960s; it continues to be a very popular choice for families with young children. As an instructor, she was strict, but caring. She strived for excellent form, discipline, and respect as the cornerstones of success.

As a proud Sokol, Sis. EllenJeanne became involved with the Board of Instructors as well as the administrative side of the organization at the unit, Central District, and American Sokol National levels, holding several offices. She was eventually named Honorary National Women's Director. As Educational Director, she provided regular Sokol history lessons, created a Czech songbook with Sis. Lorraine Zdenek, and the pair also launched the National Sokol Library, currently housed in the National Office in Brookfield. IL.

Sis. EllenJeanne wrote many sets of calisthenics, apparatus routines, and special numbers for children, juniors, and seniors. Some were independent pieces, but others were a collaborative effort. She worked with Sis. Mildred Prchal, her husband, Bro. Ed Schnabl, and with Sis. Lorraine Zdenek and Sis. Ellie Babka as live accompanists on the piano.

Her most proud work was likely to have been one particular calisthenics that was performed nationally and internationally; it was a piece that included a "wave" where groups of 8 would bend their line forward and then backward. On the field, it was beautiful with a foundation in ballet, and it was the creative genius of Sisters Prchal and Schnabl with orchestral backdrop.

Whether one looks at instructors' courses, judging clinics, competitions, calisthenics, Sleti, protocols, by-laws, or even uniforms, Sis. EllenJeanne left an indelible mark on the American Sokols, and she loved that she was a part of something so special. She was proud of her Czech heritage and even more proud of Sokol and its ideals.

Besides her Sokol work, Sis. EllenJeanne spent time with her daughters' PTA, enjoyed traveling to our National Parks with her family, dancing, reading, crossword puzzles and visiting with her family. After moving to northern Wisconsin, she worked as a volunteer with Bro. Ed at the local grade school and continued to use her Sokol background. She became a part of a senior exercise group, and then took over as the leader of the "Lively Limber Ladies".

Sis. EllenJeanne Schnabl passed away peacefully on December 14, 2022 while in the care of the Bohemian Home at the Tabor Hills Healthcare facility. Private interment with family was held at the Bohemian National Cemetery. She is survived by her daughters, Sis. Diana Rhoades (Bro. Bruce), Sis. Anita Skotnicki (Doug), her grandchildren, Bro. Kyle Rhoades (Chris), Bro. Keith Rhoades (Katie), Kerri Hembrey (Alex), Kelly Cline (Kendrick), and great grandchildren Logan, Gavin, and Lincoln.

2022-23 Educational Line-Up of Czech Film Classes (English Subtitles)

on **the 3rd Friday of the Month** to coincide with the Sokol Spirit World Beer Club which starts at 8pm! The Czech films start at 7pm in our Czech classroom upstairs and with donation of \$5 you get a free pilsner, pop, or water. Our Czech language instructor will be introducing you to all the film background and will be there to answer questions. This is our 10th season! Mark your calendars now!

April 21 He Stood at the Register/Cash Claim Chaos (*U poklady stal*) 1939/1951; 101 Minutes; GP; Comedy. The last film title, which director Karel Lamač made just before emigrating from his Nazi-threatened homeland (Czechoslovakia), was a double comedy starring Vlasta Burian. In the film, the popular comedian played the hospital nurse Kryštof Rozruch, who, thanks to a confusion with his superior, the respected mayor Mark, obtains a spa stay from the health insurance company. In the Rochov (Central Czech Republic) spa, the nurse meets the real Mark, who, on the other hand, pretends to be Ruby in front of his girlfriend Heda to test the power of her selfless love... The comedy full of confusion provided Burian and his colleagues with plenty of opportunities for improvisation.

May 19 Howling with the Angels 2006; 60 Minutes; PG 13; Political drama When Hitler's Army marched into Czechoslovakia, a young Czech army captain joined the Resistance. But he had a secret no one knew..until now. In March 1939, Hitler's army marched into Prague, Czechoslovakia. Jan Bodon, a young captain in the Czech Army – who also happen to be blond-haired, blue-eyed and fluent in German – was "asked" to join the Nazis. He promptly fled and joined the Czech Resistance Movement instead and was selected to help in the assassination of Reinhard Heydrich, the "Butcher of Prague." In this powerful documentary directed by Jan's son, Jean Bodon uncovers the truth not only about Jan's wartime experiences, but also discovers that his father was secretly a Jew in a country which underwent one of the largest extermination campaigns of the war. The assassination led to the Lidice massacre...an escape goat....In Illinois we remember this each May/June at the Lidice Commemorative Park in Crest Hill, a sister city.
