Congrats to Debbie Shields on completing the Chicago Marathon on October 12th.




Welcome to the world Danica Elizabeth, born on November 3rd to Ashley and Matt Petkus. Congratulations to the Croft & Petkus families!

Presidents Award Winners

Every year the Central District Presidents recognize individuals who show exemplary service to Sokol. This year at the district annual meeting, our very own *Cassie Croft and Mark Shrofe* received this award. Also receiving the award was Ken Fron Jr. of Sokol Tabor.

Congrats to all who were recognized and thank you for your many years of time and dedication to Sokol!

Sis. Cassie Croft started Sokol at the young age of 3. Cassie was a competitor in gymnastics, rhythmics, track and field and volleyball. Cassie was active in the junior girl class and served as director of the Junior Board. Cassie became an adult member of Sokol Berwyn-Slavsky in 2001. In 2000, Cassie represented us in the Houby pageant as Miss Sokol Berwyn-Slavsky. She joined the women's class in 2005. Cassie taught junior girls class at Sokol Spirit for five years. She became involved in Central District as the Membership Director. At Sokol Spirit, Cassie has served as our Secretary, PR/Marketing Director and 2nd Vice President. Cassie has been in charge of Sokol Spirit's involvement in the Village of Brookfield's Farmer's Market. Each week she ensures that Spirit has volunteers at the market to promote our Sokol program and all that we offer to the community. Through the program, our Wheels program and Tot's class have grown over the last couple of years. Cassie has helped promote and work many fundraisers over the years. Cassie has been an integral part of the success of Sokol Spirit's Oktoberfest that she has been involved with for 15

years! We have also held many successful wreath sales with Cassie taking the lead on this fundraiser and making sure all orders are correctly placed and received. Cassie is always looking for creative ways to raise money to keep the Sokol programs running for our community. She even took the helm to coordinate Beer Club for several years even though you will seldom see her with a beer in hand. Cassie was a member of the American Sokol National BOI. She contributed great ideas and brought her leadership skills and constructive feedback to assist our National BOI. In 2025, Cassie was the co-chair of the XXV American Sokol Slet. Cassie brought to this committee her strong management skills as well as her creativity and organizational skills. Through Cassie's many years participating in Sokol and taking on roles from Juniors class all the way up to the National level, she has shown impressive leadership skills and that Sokol is in her heart!

Bro. Mark Shrofe started his Sokol involvement at Sokol Berwyn in Tot's class in 1975. Mark later became the coach of the first class boys' class. Many of the boys liked him and Bro. Louie Prikazsky because they were so "cool!", but aside from being "cool", Mark has been a dedicated Sokol member and participant. He helped with set ups and clean ups and worked the cloakroom for many events such as the Concertina dances and the Czech plays by the club Bedrich Smetana. In 1989 Mark took over as President of the Board of Directors. This group oversaw maintaining the building and assisting with events and fundraisers. Mark held this position until 1996. When his son Dean started in Tos class, Mark joined the men's class and participated in many exhibitions and Slets. He also became involved again with the Building Management Committee and later became the

Chairman of the board. Under Mark's leadership the Sokol Spirit Building Management Committee didn't simply maintain the building, but he has gone above and beyond to modernize our facility. Some of our major projects have included using his electrician skills for the installation of new lighting systems throughout the building, making Wi-Fi available throughout our facility, overseeing the abatement and renovations of our lower hall following a major flood, a full rebuild of our parking lot, and a project to renovate our shower room. Mark's work has allowed us to continue to serve as a venue for many unit, district, and national events for the American Sokol. Mark's leadership is the reason our facilities were able to support these activities which our building was not previously equipped to do. The role on the Building Management Committee is a role that doesn't get much recognition, but we can all agree that this group is essential to keeping Sokol going.
